## Long-term conditions in children and young people (2014)

In early 2014, the NIHR issued a call for evaluative research for long-term conditions in children and young people.

The call was in support of the annual report of the Chief Medical Officer 2012 entitled "Our Children Deserve Better: Prevention Pays", and a key component of the NIHR response to the need for further research-based evidence for long-term conditions in children and young people up to the age of 25 through:

- supporting capacity building across a wide range of disciplines working with children's health and disabilities;
- increasing the volume of high-quality research on the efficacy, effectiveness, delivery and organisation of interventions and services for children and young people.
